JUNE EXAMINATION RESULTS AND TRANSCRIPTS

June examination results will be released on July 30, 2014. The results can be viewed on the Student Secure Web (SSW) at www.bced.gov.bc.ca/exams/tsw/tsw/student/. Students are encouraged to create an SSW account *before* the end of June. Then if you have problems creating an account, your school can help you before they close for the summer. An official Transcript of Grades is mailed to all Grade 12 students at the end of July. If you moved recently, please make sure your school has your correct mailing address and that this address has been provided to the Ministry of Education.

If you have problems either creating an SSW account or with your transcript, contact your school or district office, *not* the Ministry of Education. The Ministry cannot change your student record unless contacted by your school.

Additional copies of your transcript can be ordered from the Ministry of Education at www.bced.gov.bc.ca/transcript/. There is a fee for ordering additional copies of your transcript. See the above website for information.

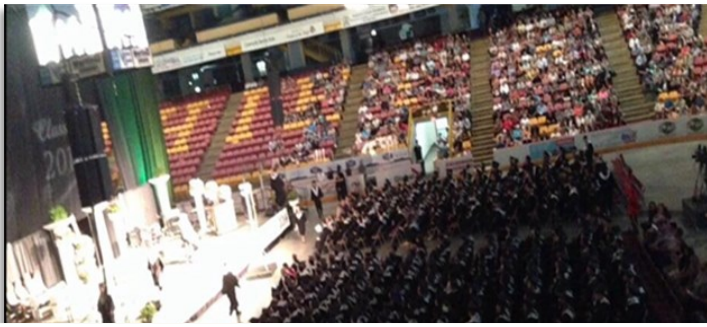
